Ministry Update

2018 Evangelism Campaigns

According to researchers, less than one percent of Quebec's 8.2 million people attend an evangelical congregation. Literally hundreds of municipalities across the province have no evangelical witness. God has not forgotten these precious people and there is evidence that He is at work. A growing number of Christians are expressing a desire to reach out with the gospel message. With, *Trouver l'espoir*, the French version of *Finding the Hope*, small churches are experiencing revitalization...

Haiti 2018



Toe-Blake spent July 4-11th in Haiti. He taught a course on Eschatology to 177 pastors from the 5th-7th. Unfortunately, the government uprising forced him to cancel the second course because of road blocks and protests. We thank you all for your continued prayers as we were not certain how and when Toe-Blake would make it back home. Praise the Lord for his safe return and for the lives touched by the ministry he had there.

The Bible dictionaries BLF Canada raised funds for this past year have been shipped to Haiti and Toe-Blake is looking forward to a return trip in 2019 to teach another course and distribute these valuable resources.



Radio Stations

The first week of December we received word from the CRTC that our application for a Christian Radio Station in Lachute, Quebec was denied.

We were devastated after we had put so much time and effort into the application. As we reviewed the details of the CRTC decision with our consulting engineer firm, we learned that the deficiencies on our application revolved around changes in the CRTC rules regarding non-commercial/not-for-profit/charity vs. specialty commercial classification designations. The rules were changed two years ago and there is still some misunderstanding of what parts of the act charities are responsible to adhere to in the application process.

There is good news. Our engineering brief was accepted as filed. This means that the frequency and location of our transmitter and antenna are approved. It is only some small technicalities on the narrative portion of the application that need to be fixed. We can re-file the application for Lachute immediately and get right back on track to get Christian radio in Quebec.

We plan to re-file early in the new year giving us time to ensure everything is in order. Please continue to pray for us and our Quebec outreach.
