


Millers' Memo

Do you remember hearing about Hurricane Irma? We weren't at home when it hit our area in September, 2017, but we're still dealing with the effects of it. The hurricane topped a number of our trees, mostly pine trees. A year later the standing trunks began to die and had to be felled. This past winter Russ took down 11 such trees on his brother's property next door and 15 similar trees on our property. During this past winter, our major project was to take down the dead trees, saw them into pieces that we pulled to a burn pile, add the branches, bits and pieces, and burn it all.

At the same time, we were planning our trip to BLF in France. Our son Jon who works with Samaritan's Purse in Liberia has been trying to get us to visit him and his family. When we looked into flights, we found that Brussels Airlines, partner of United Airlines, flies to Monrovia, Liberia. We were able to fly to Brussels like usual, then change planes and fly on to Monrovia. Two weeks later, we flew back to Brussels, spent 2 ½ weeks in France, then flew back to Tampa.

Jon's family lives next to the beach on the Atlantic Ocean, so we walked on the beach, jumped waves, enjoyed a steak and potato BBQ one evening on the beach, and enjoyed beautiful sunsets. Jon gave us a tour of ELWA station and the hospital including the buildings he was involved in building, introducing us to many missionaries and many Liberians who also work there. We enjoyed going to their church, hearing the

children sing, and going to staff devotions. A highlight was driving through the country to Yekepa in the mountains where Jon is overseeing the construction of a women's dormitory for Africa Bible College.



This year only four women joined our

missions team to BLF in France. Our major project was to finish building the brick wall of the warehouse that we began last year. However, brick layers are busy in their construction projects in this country! We invited two friends who live in Belgium to work with us. They came, but only for the last two days. However, they completed half of the area to be finished.

Fortunately, BLF had important literature projects which the women were able to complete. 1) Ariane Hiriart, a lady from Alsace, wrote a book which BLF was publishing. She is speaking at 25 churches in Alsace this summer, and BLF had made posters and flyers to advertise her speaking engagements. We needed to count the posters and flyers and package them for each church.



2) We had an order for 25 sets of Sunday School material to prepare for churches south of Kinshasa, DR Congo. Then another order came for 10 sets needed in another area of DR Congo. Last year we had laid a concrete floor in an area of the warehouse that was to be used for the SS materials. What a joy it was to see the pallets of materials in this area, arranged in order! It was no problem (for a change) to get the books and picture packets together and prepare them to be sent.

3) The Manga Bible has consisted of 5 books, 3 for the Old Testament and 2 for the New Testament. An order had come for 1500 sets. BLF had only 1300 boxes, but it would take 6500 books to make up the sets. Each book was to have a bookmark inserted in it. We set up two "work stations" and got busy! On the last afternoon the 1300 sets had been prepared, filling 8 pallets. One pallet had been sent and 3 more were ready to go. The rest were ready to be shrink-wrapped and boxed. We praise the Lord for enabling us to complete these projects! May the Lord use each piece of literature to further His purposes in the French-speaking world!


Jon & Heather
